Since World War II, a wealth of information on native fishes has been published in the "slicks." This is a first attempt to index these articles in one place. As a first attempt, it is not as perfect or complete as I would like it to be. One long-running American title is not indexed (Aquatic Life). Additionally, one (American Aquarist, 11 issues in 1949)--and perhaps several--minor titles have not been indexed. Only two foreign magazines have been indexed. In a future revision, I hope to include the British material. Besides NANFA, only the American Killifish Association, among the national associations, deals to any extent with native fishes; it has been indexed here, but only from 1971. Following is a list of the magazines indexed here, along with the abbreviations used and the years indexed:

The index itself is broken into two sections. Section One deals with the fishes listed in phylogenetical order. Where problems concerning correct nomenclature occurred, the Atlas of North American Freshwater Fishes (Lee, et al., 1980) was used as the final authority. Articles are indexed under the lowest division possible. Hence, most are indexed under the specific name of the fish. Where an article deals with more than one species, it is indexed under the genus, family, or order as appropriate. It should be noted that not all families of fishes native to North American water have been represented in the popular literature. Likewise, not all species of even popular groups are represented, which can serve to show us where work is needed.

Section Two contains the general keeping and collecting articles. This also includes the "try native" type of article that has been appearing since the first paradise fish was imported.

This index will be updated with an annual supplement. Circumstances permitting, the entire index will be revised (and hopefully expanded) within a few years. We would appreciate any criticisms or suggestions from the membership for improving this project.
